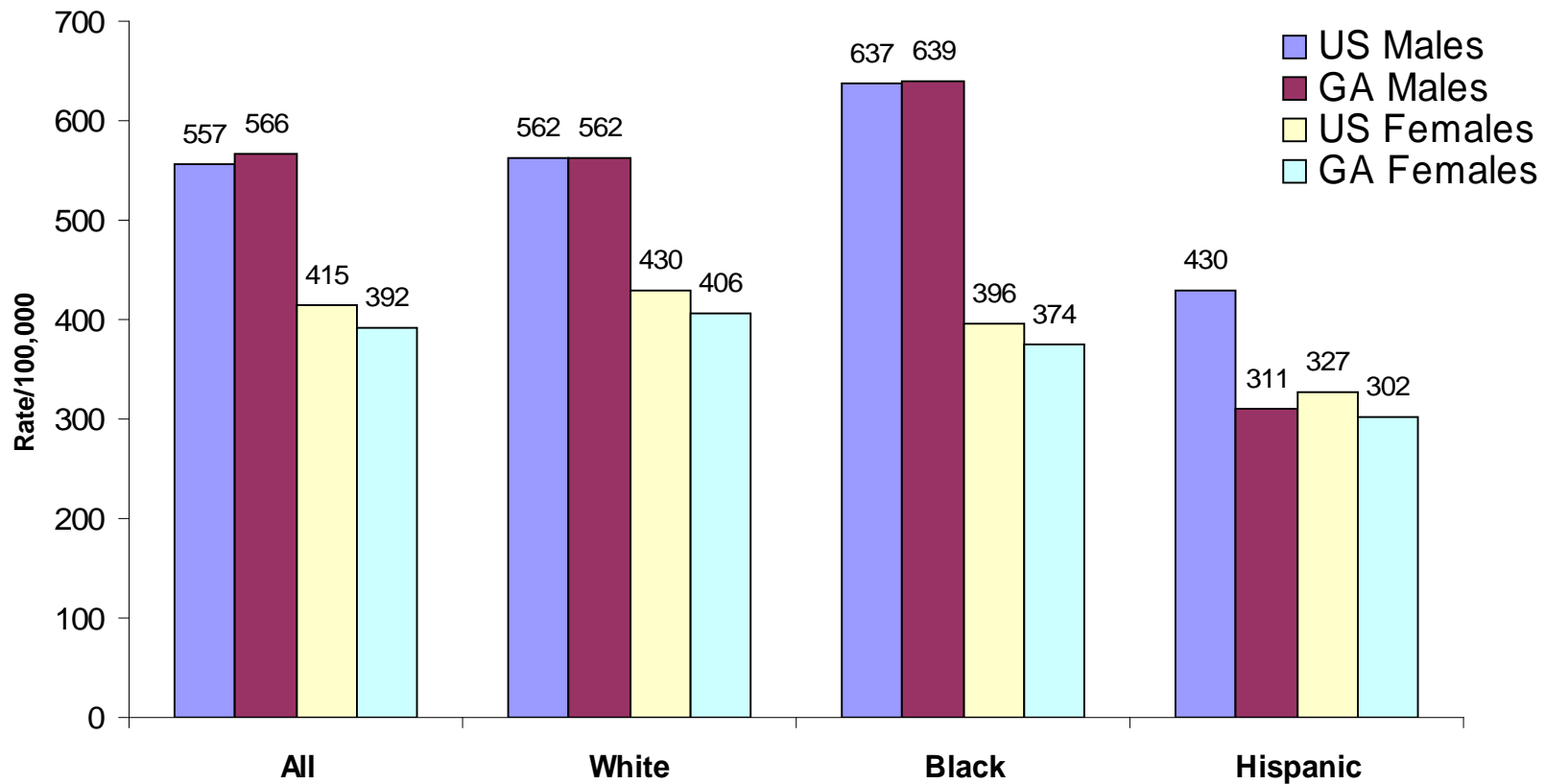


Cancer Burden in Georgia 2002-2006

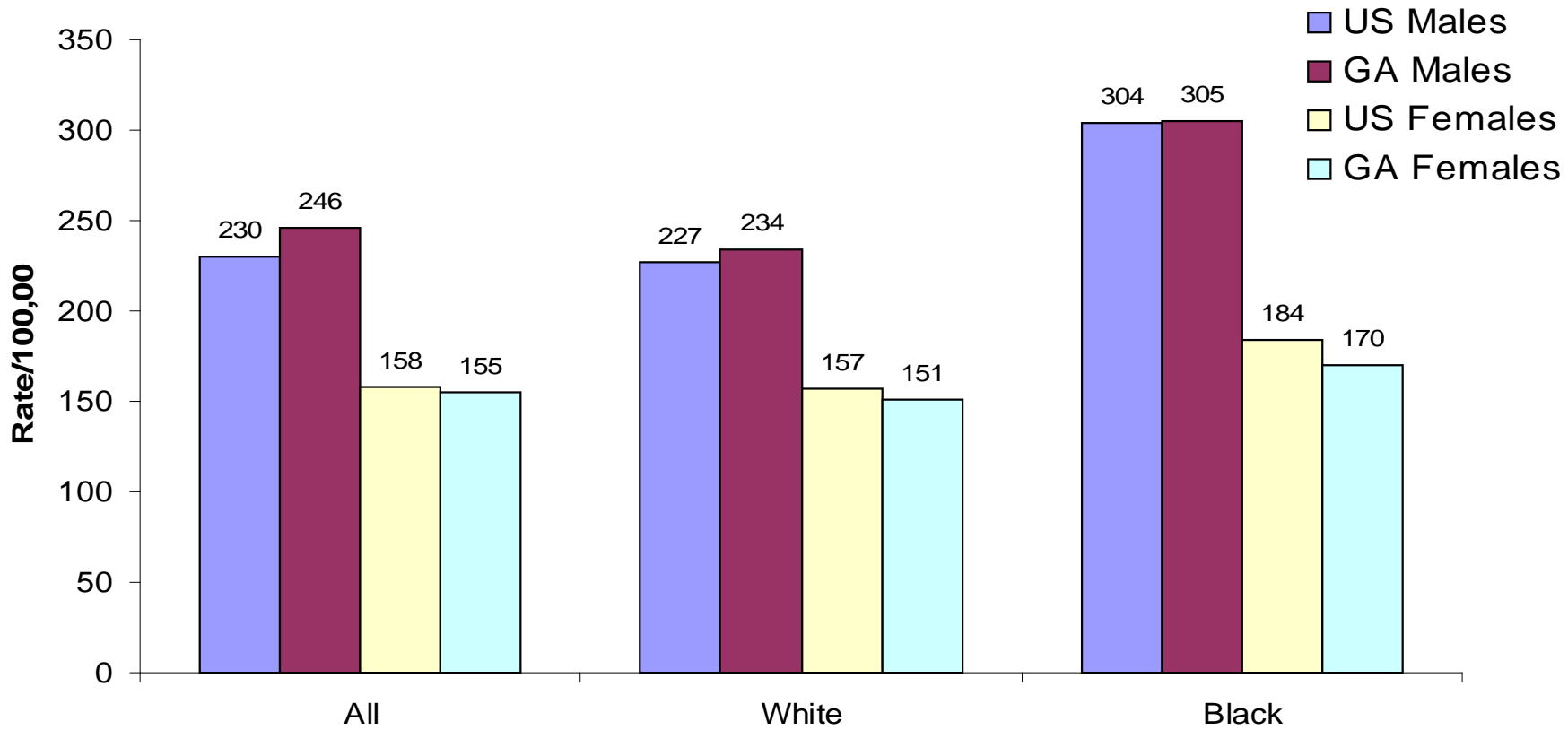
- 36,400 new cancers are diagnosed; and 14,100 die of cancer in Georgia each year.
- Overall Age-Adjusted Incidence Rate is 462/100,000. While Overall Age-Adjusted death is Rate 189/100,000.
- Males are 1.44 (44%) more likely to be diagnosed with cancer than females (566 vs 392/100,000).
- Males are 1.58 (58%) more likely to be die of cancer than females (244 vs 154/100,000)



Age-Adjusted Cancer Incidence Rate, GA and US 2002-2006

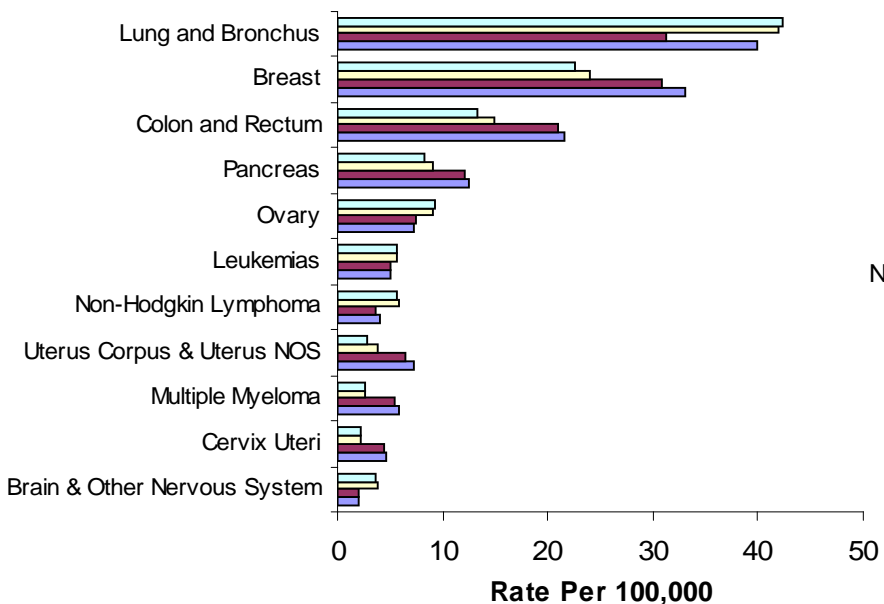


Age-Adjusted Mortality Rate, GA and US 2002-2006

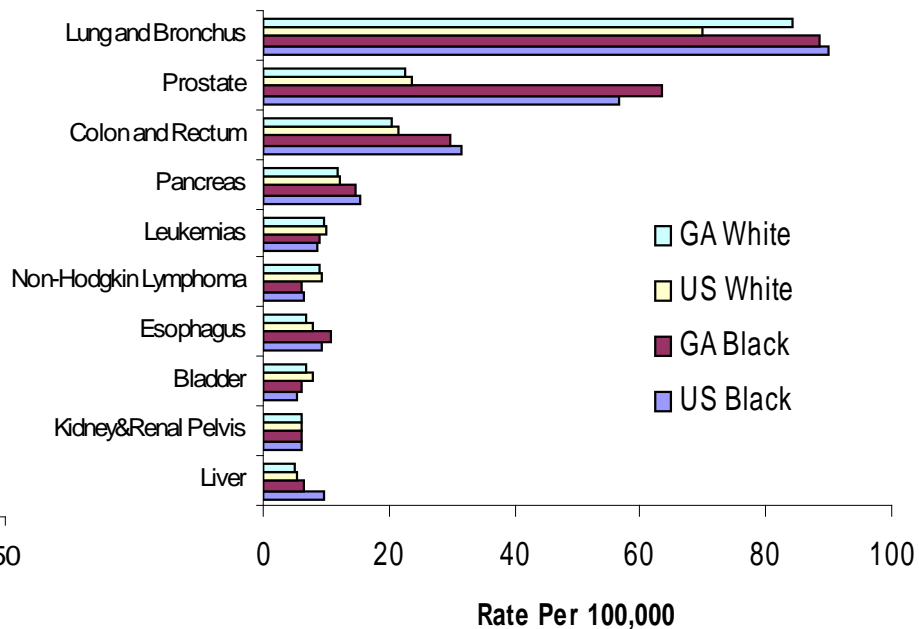

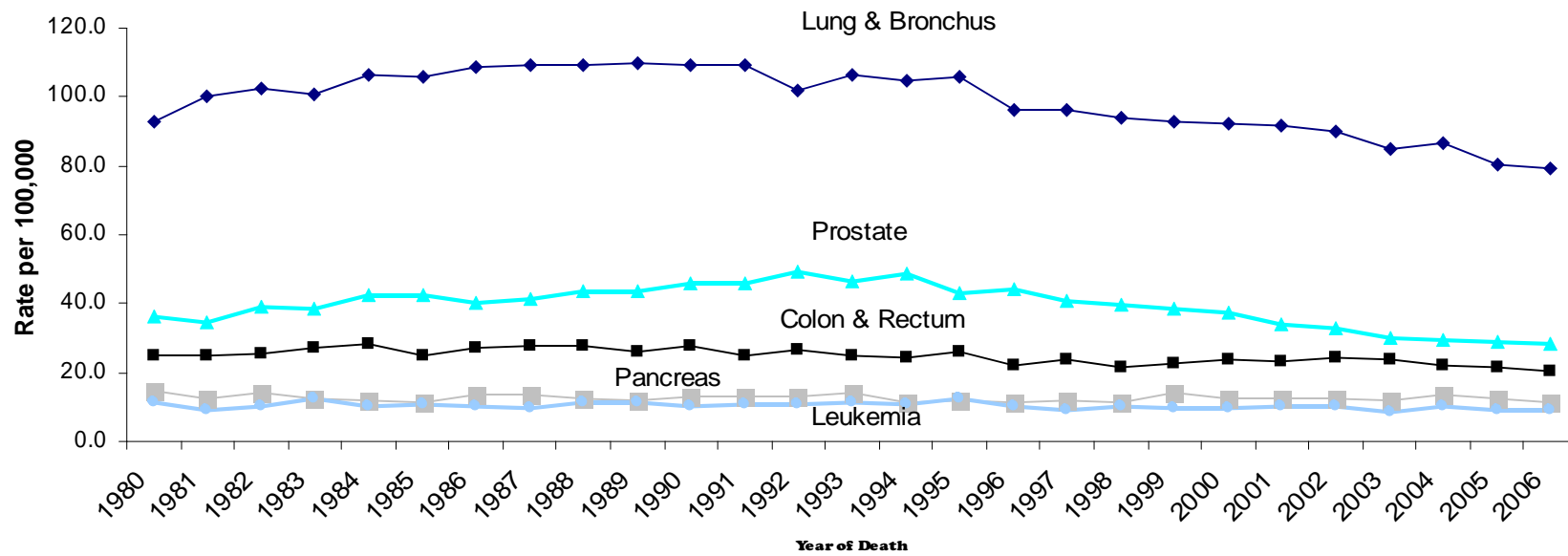

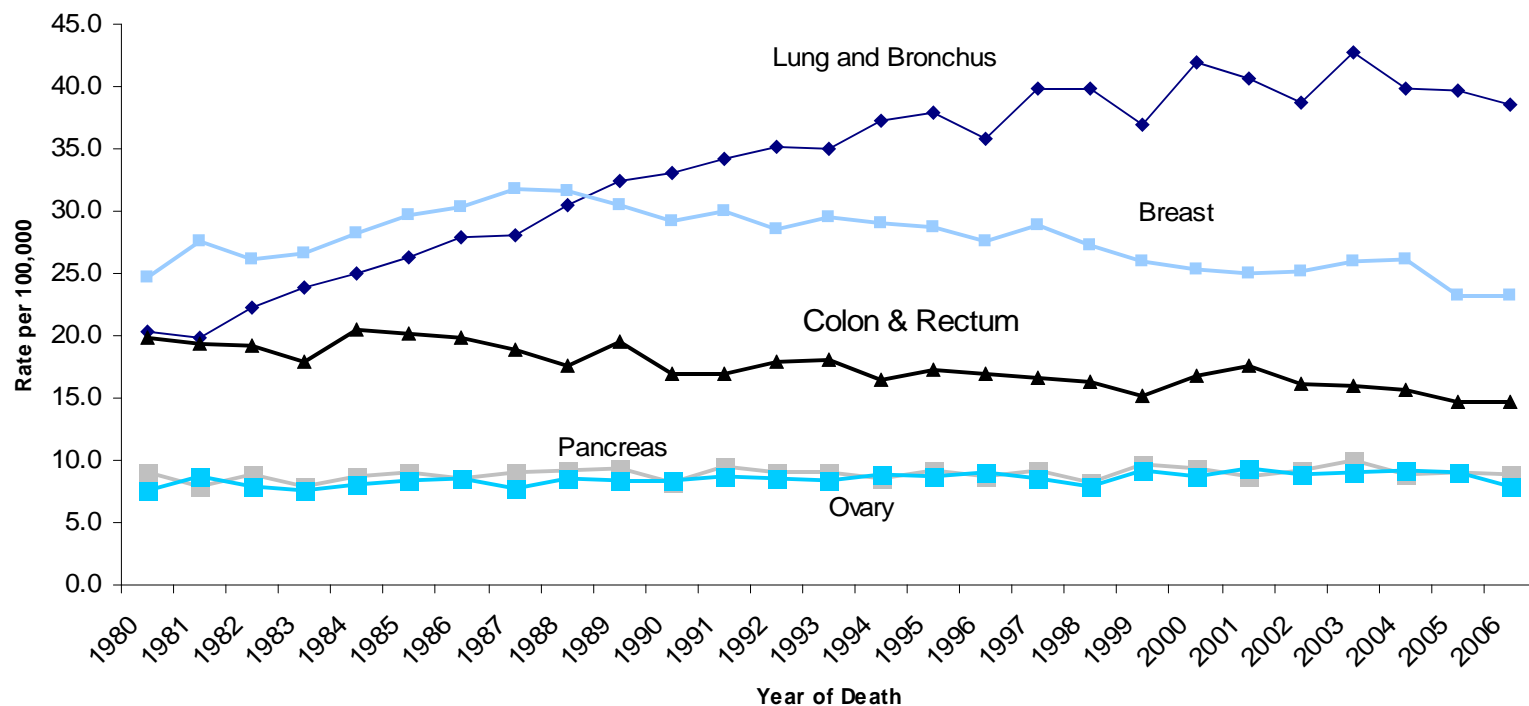

Age-Adjusted Mortality Rate, by Cancer sites, Males, Georgia, 1980-2006

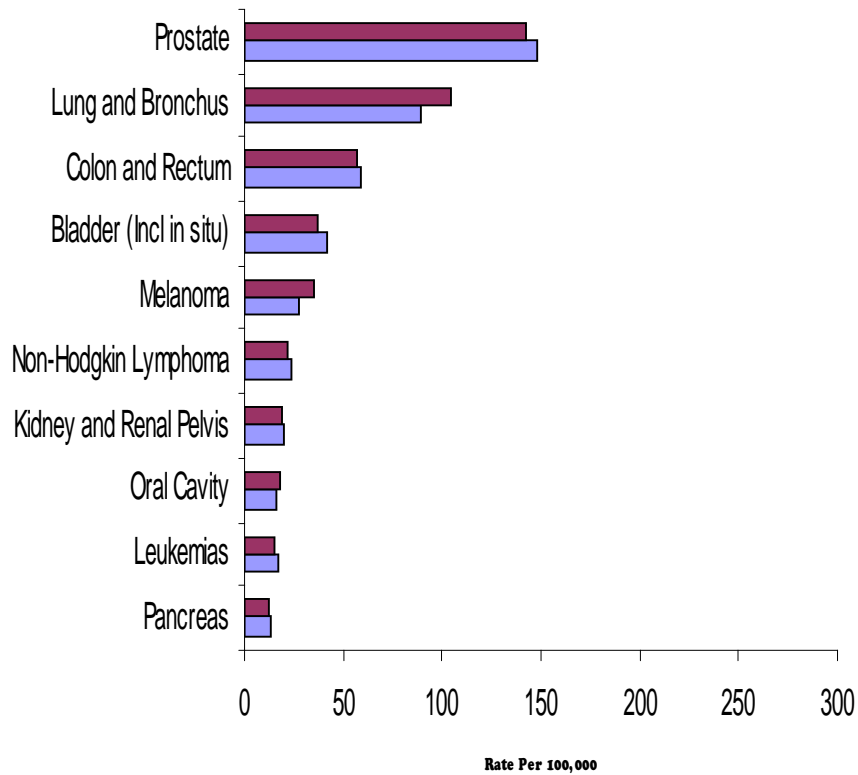


Age-Adjusted Mortality Rate, by Cancer sites, Females, Georgia, 1980-2006

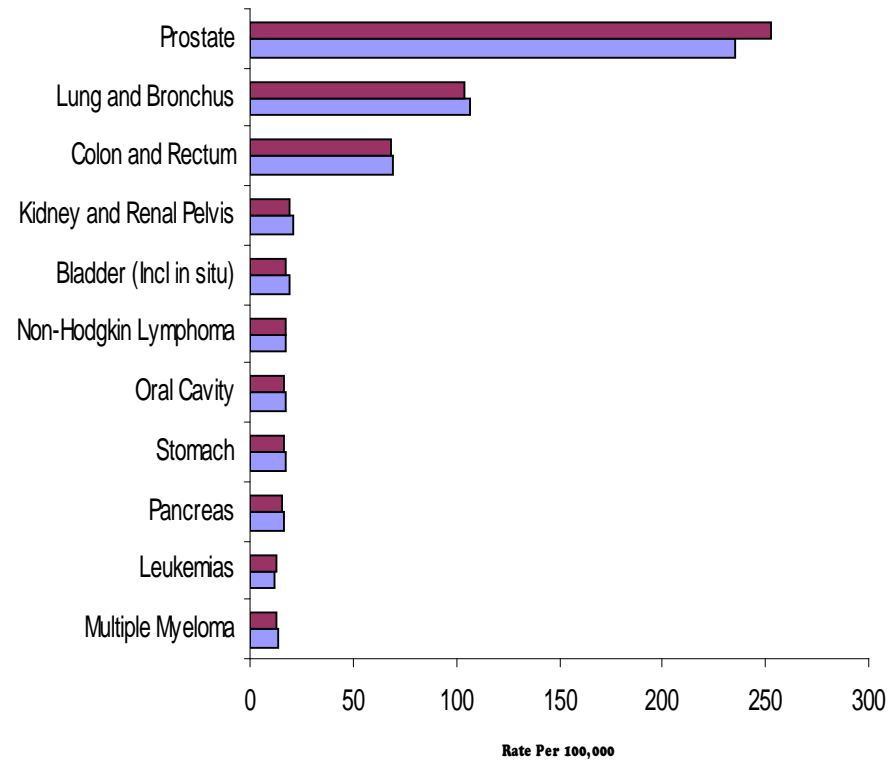


Top Cancer Incidence Site, GA Males, 2002-2006

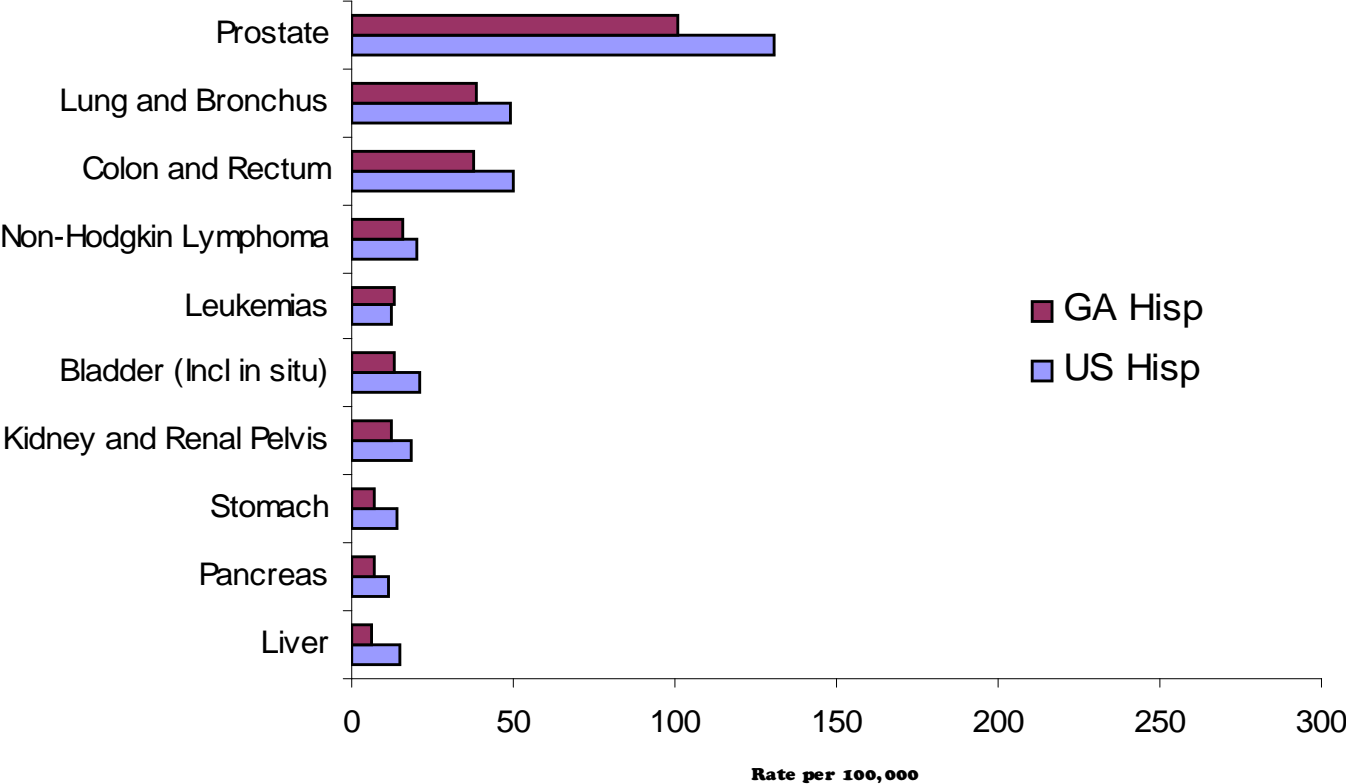

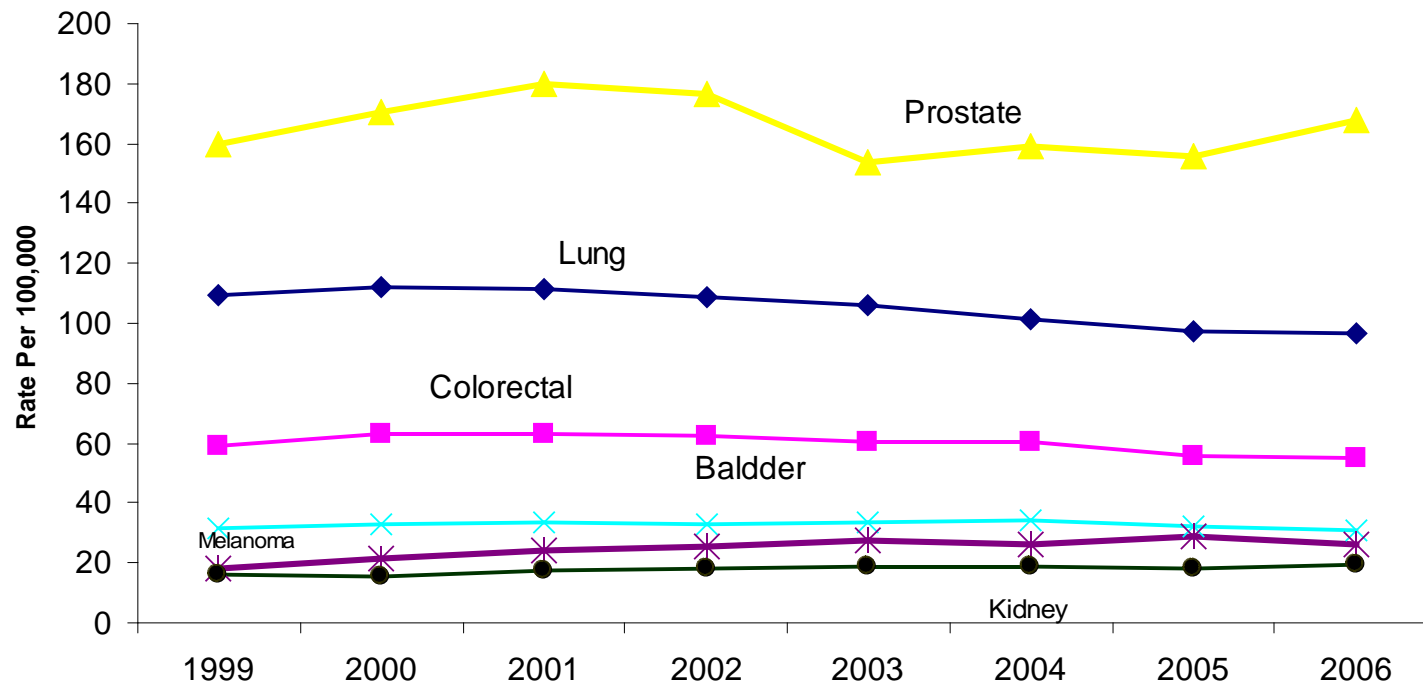

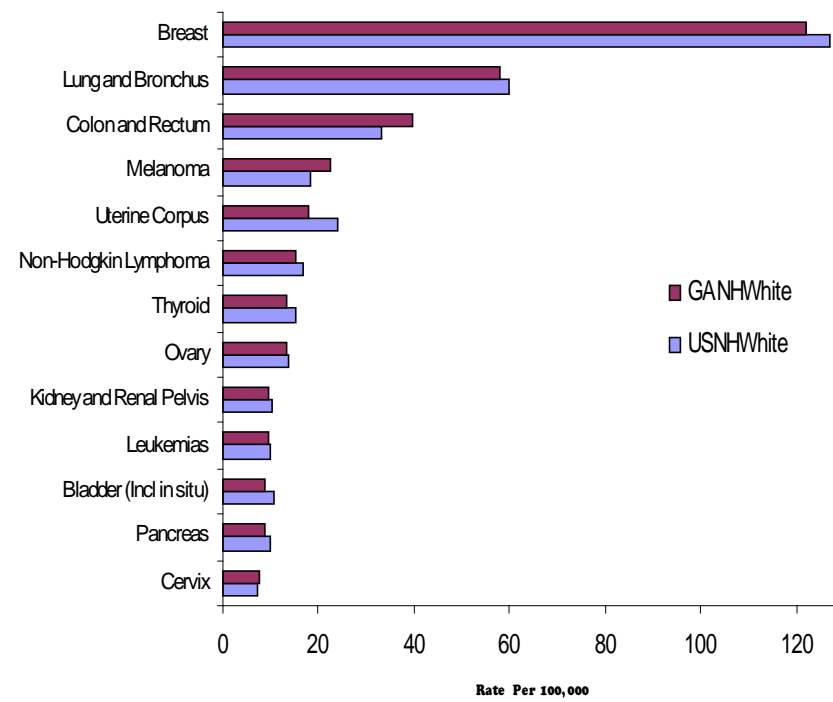
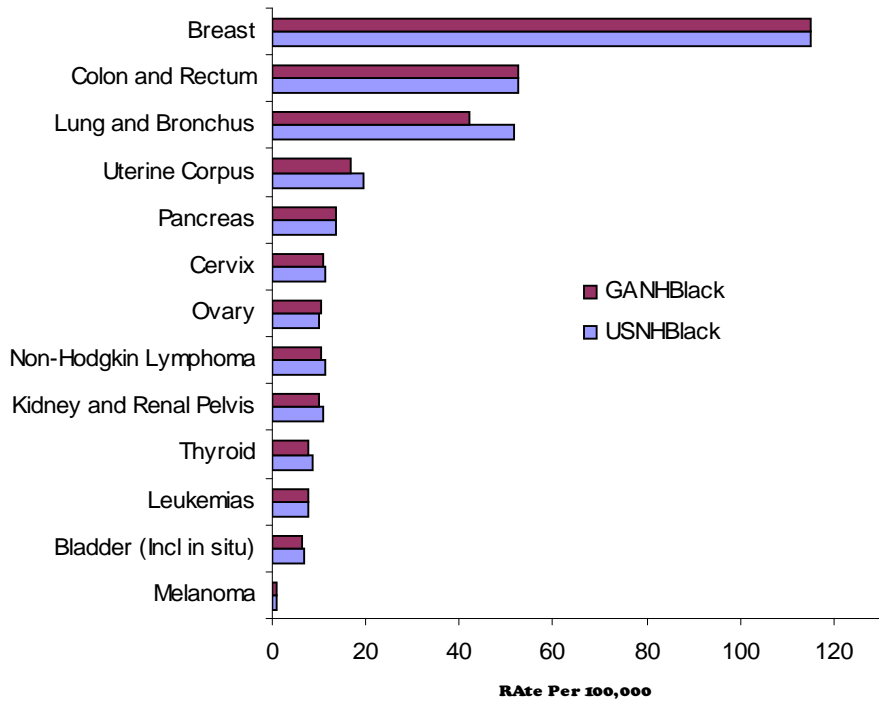
Top Cancer Incidence Site, Hispanic Males, 2002-2006



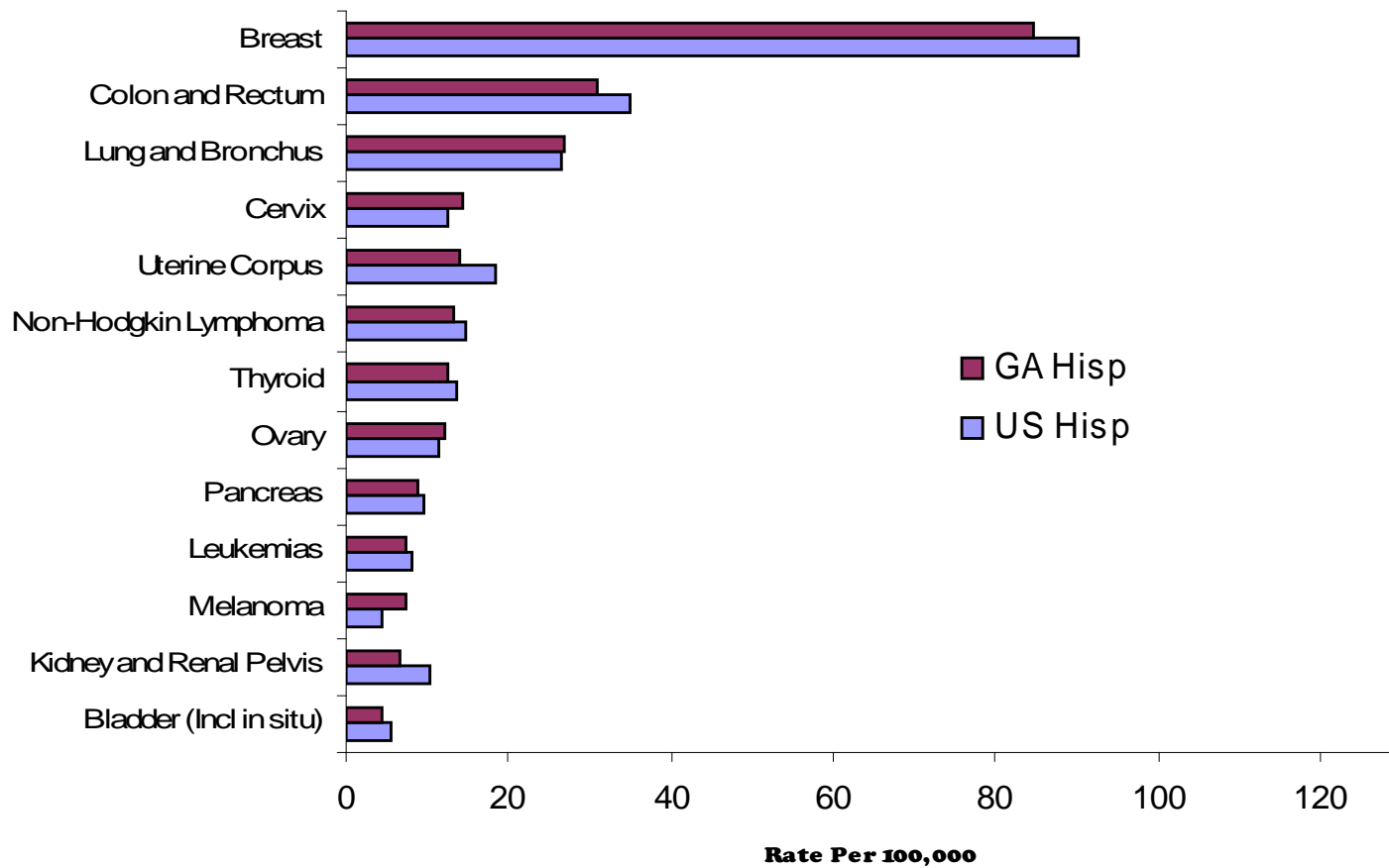
Age-Adjusted Incidence Rate, by Cancer sites, Males, Georgia, 1999-2006



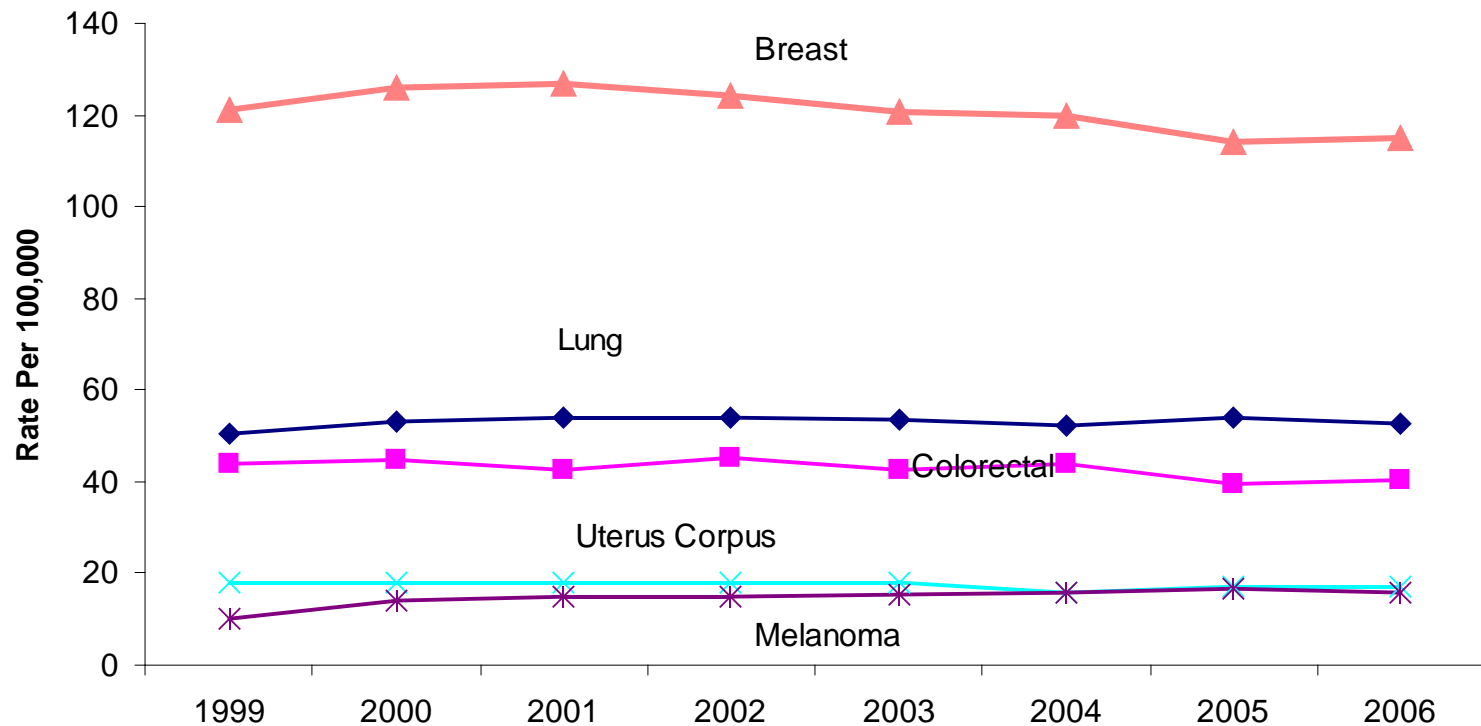
Top Cancer Incidence Site, Females, 2002-2006
